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Education Services for Schools located in Teller & Park Counties

The Teller-Park Conservation District (TPCD) offers programs and materials support for local schools to promote soil, water, and natural resources conservation. We work with teaching staff to present and develop instruction that meets or exceeds state content standards.

Some of our programs include—



Riparian Trailer for on-site visits to schools. This "display-on-wheels" demonstrates the watershed system, water cycle, conservation, stream bank erosion and restoration practices.

Ground Water Display exhibits the natural water cycle and encourages discussion of point- and non-point pollution.

Snotel Display demonstrates the nation-wide NRCS system for measuring snow-pack and forecasting water supply.

Agriculture in the Classroom programs to educate students about the importance of agriculture, the role of agriculture in a child's life, and the valuable soil, water, and natural resources that ensure the well-being of our farmlands.

Junior Conservators is a short-program, offered quarterly, for students in grades K-3. Topics vary and focus on habitat, soil health and gardening, water quality and conservation, and more.

Project WILD & Project WILD Aquatic are wildlife-focused conservation education programs for K-12 students. Project WILD links students and wildlife through its mission to provide wildlife-based conservation and environmental education that fosters responsible action toward wildlife, habitat, and natural resources.
