All applications are subject to review by the Teller-Park Conservation District Board of Supervisors. Deadline for submission is October 15, 2015. Funds are limited and will be issued on a first-come, first-serve basis.

Cost Share Policy

Teller-Park Conservation District will reimburse landowners at a 50/50 rate up to a maximum of \$250 and only for weeds listed below. Reimbursement is only for cash expenses (in-kind services do not qualify). Both contract labor and chemical expenses are eligible for cost-share reimbursement. Only CO Dept of Agriculture approved treatment methods are eligible for cost-share program.
